

At the heart of her teaching philosophy is the belief that children need consistency, understanding, and unconditional love. To check for understanding, she relies on what she affectionately calls "the spinning wheels"—the visible moments when a child's mind is connecting ideas. She also uses open-ended questions to encourage deeper thinking and help children express their understanding in their own words.

With warmth, experience, and a passion for early childhood education, Ms. Camille creates a classroom where every child feels supported, seen, and celebrated.
